





















CLARKSVILLE CIVITAN SUPPORTS BUDDY BALL





PROTECTION FROM HARM

Remember... DIDD requires you to report any suspected incidents of abuse. neglect or exploitation to DIDD's Protection from Harm Unit at 888-633-1313 within 4 hours of observation or discovery. If you fail to report and the incident results in a substantiated case, you may be subject to disciplinary action along with the person(s) responsible for the abuse, neglect or exploitation.

It's official! We were evaluated in detail at every level of the agency and passed our CQL accreditation. This voluntary evaluation system ensures we are providing the highest level of care to the individuals we support. Through this assessment by outside experts, accreditation equips us with valuable information and action steps for improvement.

MORE ABOUT CQL

CQL is The Council on Quality and Leadership. Since 1969 the council has been a leader in working with human service organizations to continuously define. measure. and improve the quality of life and services for people with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. Its vision is a world of dignity, opportunity, and community for all. The accreditation program is based on utilizing a proven framework for quality monitoring and enhancement.

CQL uses an evaluation system called Basic Assurances. BA is a tool to evaluate successful operations involving the health, safety, and human security of people receiving services as well as areas such as natural supports, social networks, employment and more. Through 10 factors, 46 indicators, and hundreds of probes, the Basic Assurances. Provide organizations with guidance for ensuring systems translate into actual practices to positively impact the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and psychiatric disabilities.

These essential, fundamental and non-negotiable requirements for accreditation fall within these 10 factors:

- I. Rights Protection and Promotion
- 2. Dignity and Respect
- 3. Natural Support Networks
- 4. Protection from Abuse. Neglect
- 5. Mistreatment and Exploitation
- 6. Best Possible Health
- 7. Safe Environments
- 8. Staff Resources and Supports
- 9. Positive Services and Supports
- 10. Continuity and Personal Security
