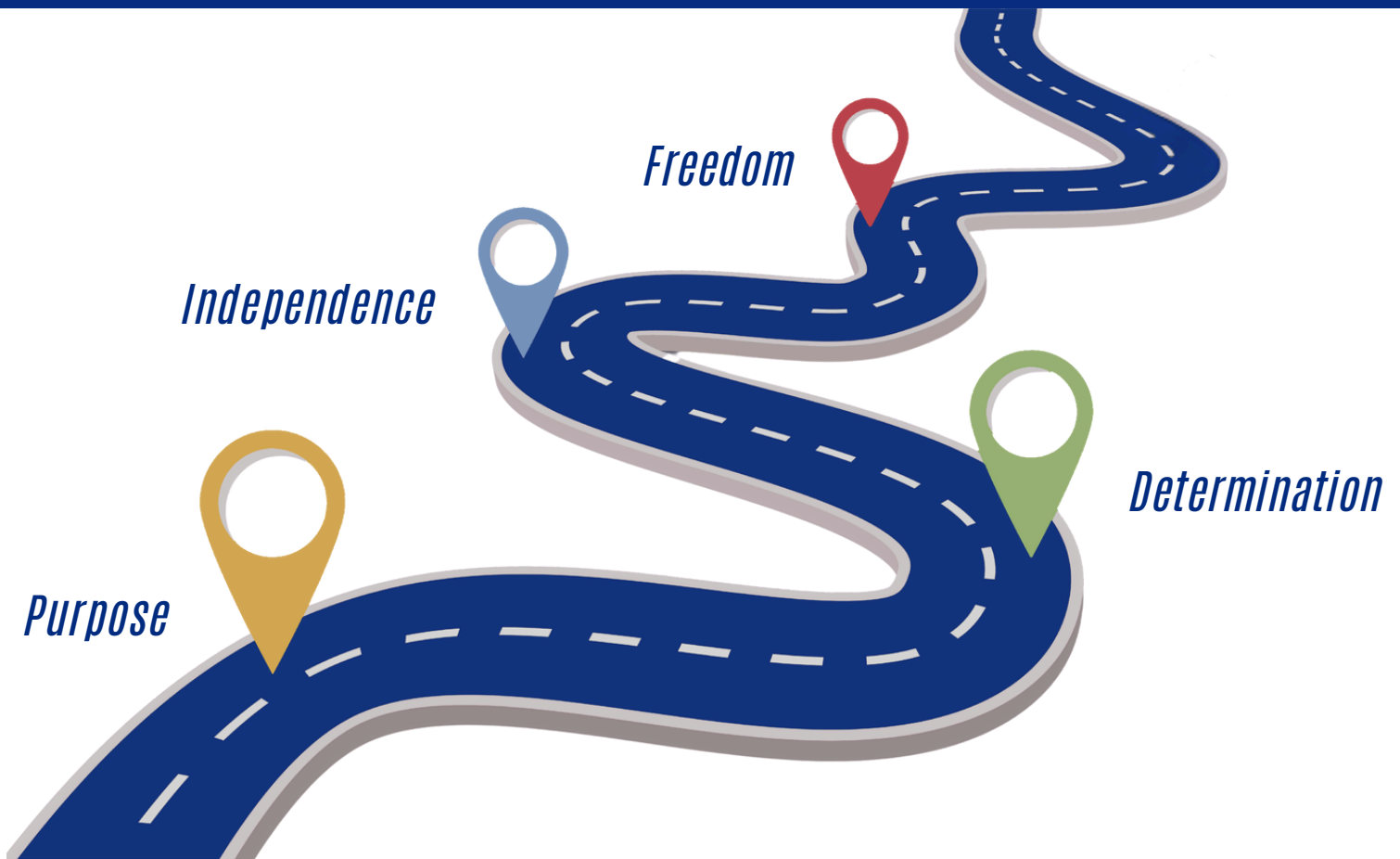

INDEPENDENCE COACHING

Home Safety:

Skills to spend time alone at home, including discretion when opening the door, how to cook safely, how to recognize and respond to home emergencies.

Personal Hygiene and Self-care:

To plan and prepare meals, maintain personal hygiene and appearance, including how to dress for the weather, as well as their career or educational path.

Health Management:

Manage health, which includes taking medications, when to see a doctor, how to schedule an appointment with a doctor, how to ask for medical help, and how to apply for insurance.

Financial Management:

Maintaining personal finances, having a personal checking and/or savings account, responsibly maintaining a line of credit, paying bills on time, developing, and maintaining a monthly budget, and understanding financial exploitation and how to avoid it.

COMMUNITY NAVIGATOR

Independent Travel:

Independent and consistent initiation of transportation to community locations

This includes the ability to identify desired locations, and then to schedule or self-initiate transportation to the locations.

Community Relationship:

Having established, recurring, and natural relationships or contacts

This includes showing independent contact with their social network, navigating social engagements, and maintaining sustainable relationships.

Community Activities:

The person leverages information or relationships within the POIs to develop new interests and opportunities, and broadens his/her natural network within the community.

EMPLOYMENT INNOVATION

Pre-Employment:

Person has identified employment, volunteering, or internship interests and developed skill sets necessary to pursue a chosen career path.

Employment:

Person obtains a competitive integrated employment position and works for 30 days with any necessary support to learn job functions.

Career Development:

Person has been given greater responsibility, promotion, and/or additional job duties and/or has taken the necessary steps to enroll in a post-secondary program.

Independence Achieved:

People are successful with their jobs and, outside of technology support, no longer need in-person employment support.
